Keswick Convention: 17 July-6 August

The 2021 Convention's theme is *Faithful*. We'll hear from God's Word how we can have confidence in his faithfulness. It's reassuring, following the uncertainties of the last year, to know we can trust Him. God is faithful and, because He is, we are called to be faithful as well.



Each week has seminars, Bible Readings and evening Celebration. This year the Convention will be on one site for the first time, with our church being used

for relays of the Bible Readings and Evening Celebrations each week. St Johns will be used in Week 3 for Keswick Unconventional. The Convention organisers ask for our prayers as they work through the new arrangements. The pandemic means there are a number of changes this year, one of which is the introduction of a registration and booking system to help manage social distancing and venue capacities for all venues except our church, which is first come first served! Most events are livestreamed and/or available for catch up. Children's events have been replaced by a family event called *Families Together*. The Convention is a great resource, available for free to us all – and it's on our doorstep and even in our own church! Come and see what it's all about – and have a cuppa and slice of cake at the same time.

Welcome to Church - Our Covid 'Rules'

We're delighted to welcome Convention visitors to physical worship with us this morning. We've reviewed our risk assessment and done everything we can to ensure your safety and protection. Due to the increasing number of infections in Allerdale, we've decided that, despite the relaxation of all coronavirus legislation by the government on Monday 19 July 2021, we will continue to operate on a covid-secure basis for the foreseeable future. This means we're continuomg "Hands, Face, Space" and you must not come into church if you have any Covid symptoms or test positive.

- **Hands:** Please sanitise your hands at whichever entrance you use (hall, church and fire exit all have sanitisers on the wall).
- Face: Please continue to wear a face mask inside our building unless you are exempt. The only exception is if you are eating or drinking or need to speak to someone who is deaf and is lip reading.
- Space: We are keeping to 1metre plus for social distancing but not limiting the size of groups. We will continue to ventilate by opening windows and doors.
- Singing: We ask you not to sing when you attend our Sunday morning worship. If you are wearing a face mask you may sing quietly or hum whenever you attend a Convention relay.
- Test & Trace: You are advised to continue to use the QR code on your smart phone but we no longer need to take your contact details unless you wish us to. The Government advise you to continue lateral flow tests twice a week (or a PCR test if you have Covid symptoms). Lateral flow tests are available via the internet or from one of the local pharmacies in Keswick.
- A steward will guide you to the worship area and show you where to sit. We'll be keeping one chair empty between groups or bubbles.
- At the end of the service you'll be guided out row by row by a steward. Collection plates will be at the exits as you go out. We're delighted to be able to offer you coffee and tea – and a biscuit! Please do enjoy a cuppa and a chat if you are able. You should leave your empty cups on the tables outside for collection.
- We know many have had your Covid vaccines, but quite understand for those of our members who prefer not to return to church just yet.

A weekly written service is available if you wish to receive it instead. Let one of the stewards know.

We hope you understand that we will continue to take these precautions to help to reduce the spread of the virus as much as possible, and to protect both our church family and visitors.
